

Recap: Bagel Brunch August 27. 2014 Lazarus and the Hurricane

hosted by Paula & Lee David and Cesare DiGuilio & Robin Vogl

Naivelters were treated to a compelling story of social justice by Sam Chaiton and Terry Swinton at Sunday's bagel brunch. They brought with them some of the members of their communal family to share their experiences with us as well.

Authors of "Lazarus and the Hurricane", the story of the grueling efforts made by this small group of Canadians to support Rubin "Hurricane" Carter in his fight for freedom after decades of imprisonment for a crime he didn't commit.

Sam and Terry described their coincidental meeting of a black youth whom their communal family "adopted" with his parents' agreement and brought to Canada where they homeschooled him along with another of their children. As part of the young man's educational experience, the educational "team" unearthed the story of Rubin Carter as an example of the justice system's treatment of black men.

When the young man wrote to Rubin Carter, it began a process that spanned over six years of efforts to support Rubin's legal team in freeing him. The group actually relocated to New Jersey for 6 long years to see their efforts through to fruition, after which they brought Rubin back to Canada to nurture him in his adaptation to a life outside prison.

The authors brought complimentary copies of their books which they generously distributed (and autographed on request).

Thanks to Paula David who moderated the session for us and warmed us up with a viewing of the movie "The Hurricane" last Thursday on Hill One.


